
BME WORKSHOP - 10th & 24th October 2013



SA TRAINING IN BARBADOS - February 2014

Parenting Programme – 20th Feb




RHPC will be facilitating the first SA 2 day foundation and parenting programme in the Caribbean. The training will take place in Barbados in collaboration with the Ministry of Education, Attorney General's Office, Ministry of Health and Parados, an NGO responsible for parenting education in Barbados.



RHPC received an award from the Barbados Government for writing and implementing a 'Conflict Resolution and Mediation Program' for young people.



RHPC will build on the collaborative success already achieved working with other organisations in Barbados and across the Caribbean.




RHPC has received interest in SA training from Jamaica, Trinidad, St. Lucia, St. Vincent and Antigua.



CHP DEGREE (2012-PRESENT)

The Community Health Practice (CHP) Degree is an innovative 3 year programme, developed by RHPC and Newham University College (NUC). It offers a parenting pathway which includes the Solihull Approach Foundation and the Parent Facilitation training. Validation is currently subject to a re-submission to the Open University.



All the participants on the BME course are due to train as SA Parent Facilitators on 24th January 2014. Participants came from a wide range of professions, including FE, Counselling, Teaching, Health Commissioning, Law and even a retired Judge specialising in mediation! Most plan to do further SA and RHPC training, and will work with RHPC as 'Parenting Associates and trainers.'

HEALTH

Social prescription aims to strengthen the provision of, and access to, socio-economic solutions to mental health problems, linking people with non-medical sources of support within the community. These might include opportunities for arts and creativity, physical activity, support with benefits, housing, employment and parenting. Bazil Hunte, is currently working with Newham's GP Clinical Commissioning Group, where he delivers Health and Community programs and provides consultancy for a number of groups.

AUTISM CENTRE (2012-present)

Newham College's new purpose built centre LS3, opened its doors in September 2013, to 20 learners aged 16-24 with autism and complex needs. As LS3's Autism Specialist and Project Manager/Lead, Pauline Riley-Hunte has agreed with Dr. Hazel Douglas, to pilot the new SA Autism and Parenting Resource in 2014. 12 parents have already signed up! RHPC will also deliver the SA foundation training to LS3's 16 support workers and 4 teachers, February/March 2014



'RILEY-HUNTE'S PSYCHOLOGICAL CONSULTANCY LTD' (RHPC 1999 - Present) is privately owned by Directors, Pauline Riley-Hunte, Consultant Clinical Psychologist, and Bazil Hunte, Consultant Health Psychologist. RHPC incorporates a number of other services and partners, including a 'CHILD & ADOLESCENT PSYCHOLOGY SERVICE' (CAPS).

RHPC specialises in the design and delivery of a range of programs and projects - some of which are highlighted on this poster. However, these are just a few of the wonderful projects we have been privileged to be a part of over the years, such as working with organisations such as Hackney Social Services on their 'Community Intervention Team' program, where we were commissioned to write a 'Parent Mentoring' package which was delivered through the Claudia Jones Organisation, a local BME NGO. RHPC also worked with CORAM, with highly complex LAC, running a support workshop for specialist foster carers. During a move to Barbados (2002-2009) RHPC worked with UNICEF, Harvard University, John Hopkins University, the University of The West Indies, HIV/AIDS Commission and Barbados Ministries of Health, Education, and the Attorney General's Office. For the latter, RHPC successfully bid for the contract to design and implement a program on Conflict Resolution and Mediation. This national program which began within a Youth Offending Centre is ongoing and in its 8th year. In February 2014, RHPC will be delivering the SA Foundation and Parenting Facilitation training to 20 professionals working on the program, as well as invited professionals from key Government Ministries and local NGO's.
